Catered accommodation is inclusive of 3 meals a day, Monday to Friday, served in the cafeteria. A 'pay as you eat' service is available at weekends. Non-catered accommodation includes kitchen diners fully equipped with ovens, microwaves, kettles, toasters and fridge freezers.

All hall charges include a weekly laundry and daily room cleaning service (term-time only), heating, lighting and internet access. All residents (with the exception of

International students) need to provide their own bedding, and those in self catering, provide their own pots, pans, utensils, plates and cutlery.

Accommodation is payable in 3 equal instalments, one per term. All rooms are subject to a £300 room deposit, payable on or before Registration day, refundable (less deductions for damages) at the end of the tenancy.

All accommodation fees are based on a 36 week contract, except for those noted as for BAC students, which are 42 weeks. You pay for your accommodation during term time plus the Christmas vacation which means you can leave all your belongings in your room during the Christmas break. Prices have been calculated to reflect the provision of services (e.g. meals for catered students, cleaning and laundry for all residents) on a term time only basis. Please note that the majority of residents will be requested to vacate their room, in full, for the Easter vacation so that the Halls of Residence can be used for conference guests. Storage space and alternative accommodation can be provided, in liaison with Student Services, for those who require it.

## **Additional Charges**

### **All Students**

#### **Students' Union Fee**

A fee for the use of the Students' Union facilities is payable at registration. This fee operates on a sliding scale and covers the full duration of a students' study on a programme.

1 year programme (including top-ups and taught masters):	£150
2 year full-time programme:	£255
3 year sandwich programme:	£255
3 year full-time programme:	£350
4 year sandwich programme:	£350
5 year sandwich programme:	£445

\*There is no charge for the placement year of a course. That is why a 4 year sandwich programme is the same price as a 3 year full time programme.

## **Course Specific Charges**

### **Agriculture Students**

Students are encouraged to undertake vocational qualifications as appropriate to augment their academic studies and prepare them for the work place. Students are encouraged to undertake the National Proficiency Testing Committee's crop spraying proficiency tests, Pa1 and Pa2, for each of which there is a charge of approximately £230. In addition, students are encouraged as appropriate to undertake the Lantra Awards Tractor & Telehandler training and testing for which there is a charge of around £250 & £320 respectively. FdSc students are able to access some of the above courses free of charge as part of the Rural Skills module in year 1 of their course.

In addition, the University College is able to offer a limited number of places for the above courses at a subsidised rate via the Rural Skills Programme which runs outside the academic curriculum.

### **Animals Students**

Students studying animal-related courses may wish to take advantage of reduced charges to sit for the Animal Medicines Training and Regulatory Authority (AMTRA) Suitably Qualified Person (SQP) qualifications. An SQP is an animal health advisor. The legal phrase SQP is a category of professionally qualified persons who are entitled to prescribe and/or supply certain veterinary medicines under the Veterinary Medicines Regulations. This qualification would be very useful for anyone working in the area of animal health where the sale of animal medicines is allowed. AMTRA charge Harper-Adams University College undergraduates a standard, reduced charge of £120 (in 2011). For more information see [www.amtra.org.uk](http://www.amtra.org.uk).

### **REALM Students**

Those students on the REALM course who wish to register for the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors' (RICS) Assessment of Professional Competence (APC) are required to pay a £450 fee to the RICS. An amount of £100 is payable at the start of the sandwich year and the balance before the final APC assessment. For registration on the Associate Route the fee is £225 upon registration and then £104 per year thereafter. Often these fees can be paid by the student's placement and graduate employer(s).

In addition, a certificate registration fee of £52 is payable on commencing the APC. APC students must join RICS as probationary members which costs £136 annually. The membership fee for Associate candidates is £104 annually (as already set out in the paragraph above). Once registered, students continue as probationary members until they have completed and they can apply for a concession against the probationary fee in respect of their final year studies on return from placement.

Student membership of RICS is free, and students are encouraged to take up this option in their first year.
