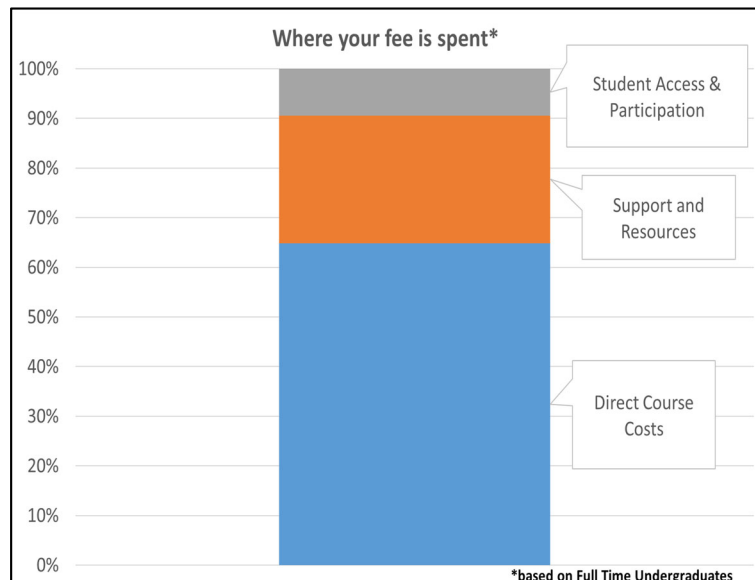

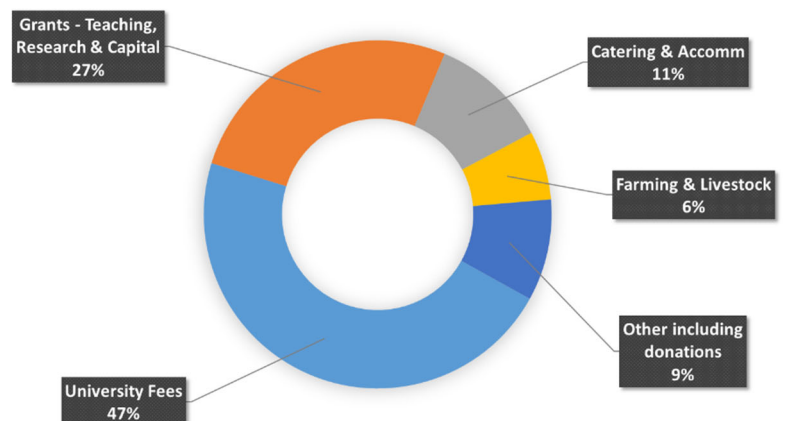

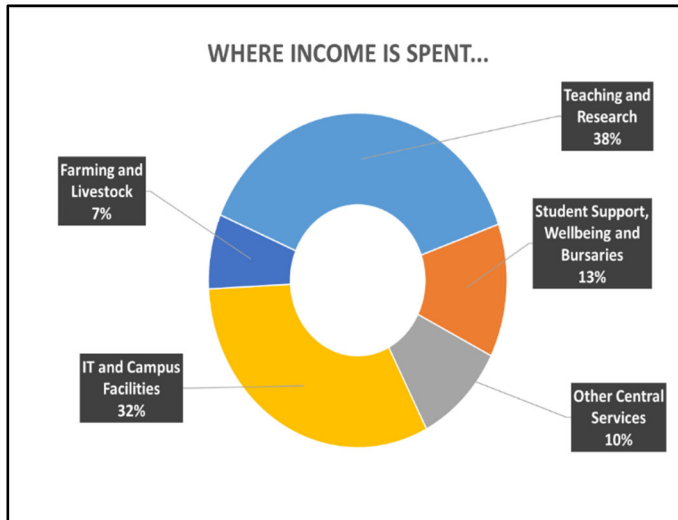
Income is generated through a variety of different activities across the institution.
